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WHO WE SERVE

All students who attend TRI-Transition to Work have the opportunity to unlock their own potential. Some of our students may present with ADHD, Anxiety, spectrum disorders, social challenges, chromosomal differences, differentiated learners, dysgraphia, learning differences or dyslexia. Our students are looking to either replace their high school career with a more vocational focus or enhance their post-graduation skills with a vocational mindset. Students are placed through their transition coordinator in their school district and have the opportunity to continue receiving related services such as Counseling, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy and Speech Therapy with us.

HOW TO ENROLL

Speak to the Transition Coordinator in your local school district. Schools will begin the referral process to TTW. Districts may provide transportation to and from the district of residence to TRI. Students may also opt for private transportation. Admission is ongoing and spots are available. Private admission not sponsored by a district is also possible.

GRADUATION FROM TTW:

Students graduate from Transition to Work in June following their 21st birthday. TTW provides transition to the world of work through resume/application completion, job searches and interview preparation. One of our core program goals is for students to graduate with work opportunities lined up or the knowledge of how to continue the process post-graduation. Staff help to guide families through the OPWDD, ACCES-VR, Medicaid Service Coordination and Social Security processes to ensure students receive the most comprehensive services available.
